Learn to Skate Program Changes

- Programs remain unchanged with exception of adding PreCanSkate classes twice per week on existing classes.

- Semester 3 registration came in low, need to look into this further and make changes for next season.
- Continued making highly effective use of the time we have.

- o Schedule changed significantly:

 - Need to address several operational issues for show.
- New staff:
 - We are currently investigating potential to hire additional staff.
- New testing system for Star Skate still incoming.
- Need for parent meetings with Director addressed and will be scheduled in season.
- Locker room floor: We are aware of the need to repair the flooring and are investigating finances.
- Test Days will be smaller and cost more for high tests.
- Need to host a Christmas party for skaters has been identified.
